- 1. Let  $f(x, y, z) = x^3y + z$  and P = (1, 0, 5). (9)
  - (a) Compute the directional derivative of f at P in the direction of the vector (2,2,1).
  - (b) Compute the maximal rate of change of f at the point P.
- 2. Find an equation for the tangent plane at the point (1,1,1) for the surface: (10)

$$x \ln y + x^2 y^3 + z^2 = 2.$$

Write your answer in the form Ax + By + Cz = D.

- 3. Let  $g(x,y) = x^3 + 2y^2 6xy + 6x$ . Find the critical points for g and identify each one as the location of a local maximum, local minimum, or a saddle point. (10)
- 4. Let h be a differentiable function of x and y and let

$$z = h(r\cos\theta, r^2 + r\theta + \theta^2).$$

If 
$$h_x(2,4) = 7$$
 and  $h_y(2,4) = 3$ , then compute  $\frac{\partial z}{\partial r}\Big|_{(r,\theta)=(2,0)}$  and  $\frac{\partial z}{\partial \theta}\Big|_{(r,\theta)=(2,0)}$ .
